children with cerebral palsy, acute traumatic brain 1 injury, and stroke. 2 BY MR. ROSETTI: 3 Do you feel that the results of the study 4 actually demonstrate sufficient evidence? 5 Α. Yes. 6 THE COURT: Anything on recross? 7 THE WITNESS: At least in CP and traumatic 8 brain injury. I'm sorry. 9 THE COURT: I'm sorry, I interrupted you 10 myself. But nothing further on redirect? 11 MR. ROSETTI: No. 12 THE COURT: And no recross, correct? 13 MR. OLDENBURG: No. 14 THE COURT: Sir, you can step down. 15 MR. ROSETTI: Call Dr. Usler. 16 THE COURT: Dr. Usler. 17 MR. ROSETTI: Raise your right hand. 18 19 DR. J. MICHAEL USLER, 20 being first duly sworn, was examined and testified as 21 follows: 22 MR. ROSETTI: Please state your name. 23 THE WITNESS: My name is officially J. Michael 24 25 Usler, M.D.

1 MR. ROSETTI: Dr. Usler, please have a seat. 2 I am going to just actually ask him to verify 3 that this is actually his signature. 4 DIRECT EXAMINATION 5 BY MR. ROSETTI: 6 Dr. Usler, I have not been able to get an Ο. 7 original copy of your direct testimony. I want to ask you 8 if this is a copy of your direct testimony in this case? 9 Α. Yes. That's signed. 10 Q. And I will ask you to sign that original? 11 Α. Okay. 12 Thank you. Q. 13 Along with that, I have marked as Exhibit A a 14 copy of your CV. Is that your copy -- excuse me, a current copy of your CV? 15 Α. I don't think so. I mean, what I see down 16 17 here -- I admit I didn't supply this to you so you got this — this is my CV. It says revised as of September 18 2003. 19 20 Q., Okay. 21 Α. So there is a more recent vintage of some other 22 things that I have done. But this is fundamentally my CV. 23 And up until 2003 that is a fair and accurate Q. 24 description --25 Α. Yes.

20	A. Correct. Yes.
21	Q. And that certification is through the American
22	Board of Medical Specialties?
23	A. I don't absolutely know that.
24	Q. Okay. Fair enough.

Pardon me? 1 Ο. I said I assume so but I don't absolutely know 2 Α. 3 that. Got you. 4 Q. 5 You are not board certified in hyperbaric 6 medicine? Α. That is correct. 7 With regard to the SPECT scans, which is really 8 Ο. my understanding why you're here, in your testimony what 9 are you describing when you say in viewing a SPECT scan 10 11 you can see increased blood flow and related regional brain function or brain activity or increase in brain 12 13 activity, what are you referring to with the increased brain activity? 14 Could you simplify that question? 1.5 Α. 16 Only if I ask it again because that was a poor Q. 17 question. What do you mean in your direct testimony when 18 you are talking about brain activity? 19 The activity on the scan is the fact that brain 20 cells have taken up the tracer material that was injected 21 22 into the person. 23 In other words, the cell function has taken up 24 the tracer. Okay. And you in your nuclear medicine field 25 Ο.

are not able to directly relate that through studies or 1 other evidence to there being a change or increase in the 3 function of the patient; is that correct? Can you simplify that one? 4 Α. 5 Ο. Sure. If a SPECT scan shows increased brain function 6 7 that does not necessarily mean that the patient will have increased function either through, you know, speech or 8 being able to manipulate or move, or that sort of thing? 9 10 Α. It does not necessarily mean that. And to your knowledge there haven't been any 11 Q. specific studies that correlate those two events, the 12 13 finding of increased brain function versus the finding of, I think Mr. Rosetti called it, clinical function? 14 Α. That is correct. 15 MR. OLDENBURG: That's all the questions I 16 have. 17 THE COURT: All right. 18 Redirect? 19 20 REDIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. ROSETTI: 21 The studies simply show that the brain is 22 Q. functioning better? 23 Α. Yes. 24 Thank you, Doctor? 25 Q.

THE COURT: Recross? 1 MR. OLDENBURG: No questions, Judge. 2 THE COURT: Dr. Usler, you can step down. 3 Thank you. MR. ROSETTI: Judge, Petitioner rests. 5 THE COURT: All right. With regard to 6 closing -- anything in rebuttal? Nobody is calling 7 8 rebuttal witnesses, are they? Q MR. OLDENBURG: No, Judge. THE COURT: With regard to the time frame we 10 are looking at, as indicated before we will expect 11 proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law. 12 13 Do counsel have any recommendations regarding the amount of time that would be required for that? 14 15 MR. ROSETTI: Judge, I'm assuming, as we 16 discussed, there will be no transcript? THE COURT: Right. You can obtain under the --17 I mean, as far as a copy of the tapes, you can obtain 18 a copy of the tapes and then have that transcribed at 19 20 your own cost. There is a minimal fee that is 21 charged by the clerk's office and I am not sure what the current fee is for the cost of the actual tapes. 22 23 But those are available to you upon request with 24 payment of the fee, and then you could have that

transcribed, you know, for your use.
