

On 06-22-01-Fri, at 1110 hours, I responded to St Louis Children's Hospital 12 East 47 in reference to threats via e-mail directed at Doctor Edwin Trevathan of the Pediatric Epilepsy Center.

Upon arrival, I spoke with Nurse Practitioner Kayla Kramer, who stated she received an e-mail from Doctor Trevathan, who is in England, advising her that a person by the name of David Freels had been sending him threatening e-mails regarding Doctor Trevathan's expert opinion to the Georgia Medicaid on the topic regarding hyperbaric oxygen treatment for brain injury people. Doctor Trevathan stated in his opinion that there is no evidence that such treatment is effective for brain injury and there is concern that hyperbaric oxygen might have some risk to it.

In the e-mails, Freels blames Doctor Trevathan for his son's inability to get the treatment he wishes him to have in Georgia and also blames him for his financial difficulties. Freels also, according to Doctor Trevathan, attempted to track his patients through the internet, even though to the best of Trevathan's recollection, the two have never met or spoke by phone.

At the time of this report, it was unclear whether Freels had actually threatened physical harm to Doctor Trevathan's life. However, Trevathan stated he felt threatened by the e-mails.

I spoke with the Information Desk at St Louis Children's Hospital and advised him that any calls directed to Doctor Trevathan from Georgia or anyone requesting Doctor Trevathan by the name of David Freels, to contact Security immediately. That information, along with extra hourly patrols of 12 West 47 were placed in the Security Log by Communications Officer Taryn Prince.

Also, per Doctor Trevathan, he will be returning from England on 06-23-01 and also returning to work that same day.
